Evidence of Impact – PE and Sport Premium 2024–2025

Total PE and Sport Premium allocation: £19,130

Total PE and Sport Premium spent: £19,229.30

Overview

The PE and Sport Premium funding has had a significant and positive impact on pupils, staff, and the wider school community at The Churchill School during the academic year 2024–2025. The funding has supported improvements across all five key indicators: increasing participation, raising the profile of PE, improving staff confidence, broadening sporting opportunities, and increasing participation in competitive sport.

The funding has enabled the school to provide high-quality physical education, wider sporting opportunities, enhanced staff development, and increased participation for all pupils from EYFS through to Year 6.

Key Achievements and Impact

1. Increased Engagement of All Pupils in Regular Physical Activity

The PE and Sport Premium funding supported pupils in being more physically active throughout the school day.

- Active lunchtimes and breakfast clubs provided regular opportunities for structured physical activity.
- New balanceability bikes were purchased for EYFS, enabling pupils to develop balance, coordination, and confidence.
- Harry Nunn from Next Generation worked with EYFS pupils over two terms to develop balanceability skills, ensuring early physical development and engagement in physical activity.
- All pupils were provided with access to after-school sports clubs, ensuring every year group had the opportunity to participate in physical activity beyond curriculum lessons.

Impact:

- Increased participation in daily physical activity across all year groups.
- Improved physical development and confidence in EYFS pupils.
- Greater enthusiasm and engagement in active lifestyles.

2. Raising the Profile of PE and Sport Across the School

PE and sport continue to play a vital role in school life and the wider school culture.

- The Churchill School achieved the **School Games Mark Gold Award**, recognising the school's commitment to providing high-quality sporting opportunities.
- Sports leaders from Year 5 and Year 6 successfully organised and ran KS1 Sports Day, demonstrating leadership and responsibility.
- Sporting achievements and participation have been celebrated across the school.

Impact:

- Increased pupil pride, motivation, and enthusiasm for sport.
- Development of leadership skills in upper Key Stage 2 pupils.
- PE and sport recognised as an important part of school life.

3. Increased Confidence, Knowledge, and Skills of Staff in Teaching PE

The school has worked closely with external providers to enhance staff skills and ensure high-quality teaching.

- Next Generation provided CPD and specialist coaching to support teachers in delivering PE.
- Staff gained increased confidence and improved subject knowledge through working alongside specialist coaches.
- Staff are now better equipped to deliver engaging and progressive PE lessons.

Impact:

- Improved quality of PE teaching across the school.
- Increased staff confidence in delivering PE lessons independently.
- Sustainable improvements in teaching practice.

4. Broader Experience of a Range of Sports and Activities for All Pupils

Funding enabled pupils to access a wide variety of sports and physical activities.

- Pupils participated in multiple intra-school and inter-school competitions across different sports.
- After-school clubs provided opportunities for pupils to experience new sports and activities.
- The PE curriculum provided structured progression, helping pupils understand rules, skills, and competition formats.

Impact:

- Pupils developed skills across a wide range of sports.
- Increased confidence, teamwork, and enjoyment in physical activity.

- Greater understanding of sports and competitive participation.

5. Increased Participation in Competitive Sport

Competitive opportunities were significantly increased throughout the academic year.

- Pupils participated in inter-school competitions across multiple sports.
- Intra-school competitions enabled all pupils to experience competitive sport.
- Sports leaders supported younger pupils, increasing engagement and participation.

Impact:

- Increased number of pupils participating in competitive sport.
- Improved teamwork, resilience, and sporting attitudes.
- Greater engagement across all year groups.

Sports Leadership

Year 5 and Year 6 sports leaders played an important role in supporting school sport by:

- Supporting and running KS1 Sports Day successfully.
- Acting as role models for younger pupils.
- Developing confidence, leadership, organisation, and communication skills.

- Improved pupil leadership opportunities.
- Increased pupil responsibility and confidence.
- Positive role modelling across the school.

The PE and Sport Premium has created sustainable improvements that will benefit the school long term.

- Staff have improved knowledge and confidence in delivering PE.
- Strong partnerships with external providers such as Next Generation.
- Increased sporting opportunities embedded into school provision.
- Improved engagement and participation from all pupils.
