<p>Sports across the school continue to provide numerous examples of high achievement.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Participation in school PE lessons is extraordinarily high. • Quality of PE and Games continues to increase. • Successful partnership with Hawkinge Primary continues to develop with all children taking part in showcasing events as well as competitive or fair play based competitions. • School representation in inter-school competition is regular and demonstrates improvements to school provision. • The school football team won 3 and drew 1 of their 4 group matches in the Herald Cup which is fantastic. This is made even more amazing when you note that 30 different children took part in these matches. • Our first girl's football team played 7 matches against other school winning 3 drawing 2 and losing 2.
